The Dental Hygiene program offers a challenging 2-year curriculum meets the standards of our accreditation board, the Commission on Dental Association (CODA) while preparing students to master key competencies needed to become a dental hygienist. Our students receive essential hands-on training in the dental clinic where they serve approximately 1500 – 2000 members of the community annually. Our students also develop their communication and critical thinking skills while working with the public. We are proud to say that PSC Dental Hygiene Program graduates are knowledgeable, professional employees when they enter the workforce community.

Naming Opportunities

Significant gifts to the college provide opportunities for donors to designate the name of a college facility or program in honor of the donor or another person. 
CAPITAL NEEDS:
