Keeping Up with Alumni

In Pensacola State College's 75 years, **123,583** unique students have graduated and/or completed a program at PSC. Foundation donors have often supported their education and college experience.

In 2023, **161** donors who are alumni and members of the PSC Alumni Association donated \$87,593.60 in cash gifts, \$1,640.40 in stocks, and over **\$6,700** gifts in kind.

With the addition of these scholarships, Pensacola State College now offers 315 privatelyfunded scholarships to students.












New Scholarships


Earl Peyroux Memorial Endowed Scholarship

Late Chef Earl Peyroux, graduate of Le Cordon Bleu in Paris and understudy to chefs such as Julia Child and Paul Prudhomme, became a household name and a



local celebrity chef in Pensacola. As a culinary instructor at PJC in the 70s, Peyroux was scouted for a 13-episode cooking show with WSRE. Due to its popularity, "Gourmet Cooking with Earl Peyroux," aired 600 episodes over 18 years, getting picked up by the Public Broadcasting System in 1982 and reaching a national audience in the early 1990s.

Peyroux is fondly remembered as a Southern gentleman whose love for cooking was rivaled only by his love for sharing cooking tips with others. This scholarship was established by many of Peyroux's loved ones, with Drs. Tip and Ellen McKnight and Hal George spearheading the efforts.



Helen Ihns Culinary Scholarship

Helen Long Ihns and late husband, Juergen Richard "Dick" Ihns, have been dedicated supporters of PSC since 1996. They met at Purdue University in the 50s before settling in Pensacola in 1965. Active members of the community, Dick and Helen served on various boards, volunteered, donated generously, and engaged in krewes. They held a special appreciation for culinary, visual, and performing arts. Their enduring bond lasted 54 years until Dick's passing in 2010, after which Helen generously chose to establish a scholarship in support of culinary arts students. "PSC plays an important role in the community, because it provides avenues for all types of students, with widely varying interests and life goals." says Helen, reflecting on the significance of vocational education.








Jerry Wade Mathes Electrician Apprentice Scholarship

Jerry Wade Mathes was a lifelong resident of Pensacola and a member of Escambia Lodge #15, Scottish Rite, and

the Hadji Shrine. In 1973, he founded Mathes Electric, a Panhandle-based independent electrical distributor and lighting showroom. This was the beginning of the many businesses he established before his passing in 2009.

In recognition of Jerry's dedication to the profession, his daughter, Kimberly Mathes Cheney, and granddaughter, Lauren Paige Cheney, now co-owners of The Mathes Group, have chosen to establish a scholarship in his honor. This scholarship will support aspiring electricians pursuing education at PSC. Kim and Lauren's decision to select Pensacola State College for the scholarship is rooted in their firsthand experience of the Institution's nurturing environment, characterized by close relationships between students, faculty, and staff.





Melba Bayers Meyer Charitable Trust Scholarship

Melba Bayers Meyer was born on June 17, 1910 in Albert Lea, Minnesota. She lived in communities located in the northwest and northeast U.S. before marrying businessman



F.E. Meyer. Together, they operated Meyer Shoe Company, located in downtown Pensacola. In their free time, the pair enjoyed giving generously to civic movements and community development. Upon her death in 1995, the Melba Bayers Meyer Charitable Trust was established. The Trust supports charitable causes primarily focusing on the needs of children, indigent Native Americans, and neglected animals in Pensacola, Florida, and Alabama. In 2023, the Trust established a scholarship for Native American students at PSC who maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.



Morette Company Endowed Scholarship

Rick Morette dedicated his professional life to the development and growth of Morette Company. After his passing, his wife and children, Sharon Morette, Mike Morette, and Nikki Morette Bell, assumed leadership roles within the company.

The Morette family and Morette Company are deeply involved in philanthropy and community service. Mike currently serves as the President of the PSC Foundation Board and Nikki generously lends her time and expertise to the PSC Holiday Experience event committee. Additionally, the family has established an endowed scholarship in honor of Sharon. The Sky Terrace of the newly constructed BEAR JONES MOORE REEVES Center for Math and Advanced Technology was named in honor of the Morettes. This newly established endowment honors the morals and perseverance of Rick that were instilled into Morette Company, encouraging others to "give more and be more."


Recognizing Scholarship Change Makers and Distinguished Donors

2023 in Review

- In September, Pensacola Sports pledged \$250,000 in support of PSC Athletics, the Andrews Institute was welcomed to the athletic recovery team, and 250 guests were introduced to players at the Annual Pirate Experience.
- In September, Women's Soccer won their conference in their inaugural season. The team won the Region 8 title.
- In October, the Ambersley and Peña Court was unveiled to celebrate Pete Peña and Joe Ambersley's longtime friendship. Pete Peña was recognized for his distinguished service as a basketball coach and Joe Ambersley and his family were recognized for their history of supporting PSC basketball.
- In November, the annual Pars for Pirates Golf Tournament raised \$15,532.
- In November, Volleyball won the state tournament and advanced to fourth in the nation during the NJCAA National Championship in Cedar Rapids, IA, the farthest a Florida team has gone in their division. They ended the year with a 34-5 record.
- In December, student athletes recorded a departmental GPA of 3.41 for the Fall 2023 semester.


