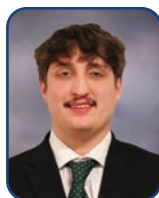

ENHANCING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: ENDOWED CHAIRS

Endowed chairs are prestigious academic awards that recognize outstanding faculty by providing financial support—beyond their salaries. Faculty can use their award for **research and professional development that enhances their teaching.**

Since 1996, generous donors throughout the PSC community have funded **fifteen endowed chairs** whose combined principal now exceeds **\$1.2M**. Many of Pensacola State College's endowed chairs bear the names of notable alumni, community leaders, or influential leaders in their disciplines. For donors, this designation offers a meaningful opportunity to create a personal legacy and make a long-term contribution to the advancement of education.

In 2025, **seven new teaching chair awards** were made to exceptional PSC faculty, and an additional seven awards continue from 2024, as many awards are multi-year. The new 2025 awardees have a combined total of **131 years of service** to the College!

BEVERLY GILLESPIE MARCHELOS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP



Beverly G. Marchelos led a distinguished career that reflected a lifelong commitment to service and advocacy. Working in diverse psychiatric care settings, and in senior social work in Germany, Beverly received the U.S. Army Europe's highest civilian service award and became one of the first civilian Chiefs of Staff.

With her husband of 60 years, Dr. George F. Marchelos, she's traveled to 157 countries. This scholarship, established by George at their shared alma mater of PSC, honors Beverly's remarkable legacy in social work, public service, and lifelong dedication to enriching the lives of others.

STEPHANIE CAMILLE JOHN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The John family's commitment to education at Pensacola State College spans more than two decades. Their legacy began in 2001 with the establishment of their first endowed scholarship and has grown with the creation of their fourth, the Stephanie Camille John Endowed Scholarship.

Stephanie, the eldest of the John children, was raised in Pensacola and exemplified her family's devotion to learning. She pursued language and research at Emory University and built a distinguished career as a medical librarian, uniting intellectual curiosity with a passion for helping others.

Her brother, Joseph R. John, III ('Joe'), established this scholarship in her honor. A PSC graduate of the 1970s, Joe felt continuing the family legacy is both humbling and deeply meaningful. Together, the John family's generosity reflects a lasting investment in students, education, and service at Pensacola State College.

LIESJE KELLY LPN SCHOLARSHIP

For over 25 years, Liesje Kelly was a dedicated nurse serving others in Pensacola with compassion and faith. Her path to nursing reflected both perseverance and commitment. While raising her two young children, Liesje completed three programs of study at Pensacola Junior College from 1994 to 1997. She earned her Associate of Science degree in Medical Secretarial Technology, followed by a certificate in Medical Assisting, and ultimately her Licensed Practical Nursing certificate.

Nursing was her calling. Known for selflessly helping neighbors get to appointments, providing diapers and baby clothes to new mothers, and volunteering for the underserved, Liesje was a true example of compassion in action. She found joy in bringing comfort, laughter, and hope to others.

In 2025, when Liesje passed away at the age of 53, her friends and family chose to honor her legacy by establishing a scholarship to support LPN students at the institution where she got her start.

SUSAN LANNING PATHWAY TO SUCCESS SCHOLARSHIP

Susan Lanning is a retired Air Traffic Controller committed to supporting educational opportunities. She participates in various charitable activities, primarily focused on enabling people to access college education.

Although she graduated from a different university, her mother attended Pensacola State College in the 1940s, when it was first established. Years later, Susan met her husband, who had attended PSC in the 1980s.

After evaluating multiple colleges, Susan chose PSC as the best institution for her mission to enhance people's lives. This scholarship benefits students pursuing certificates in a variety of fields ranging from CNC and robotics to critical care nursing and human resources.

SUSAN RAGAN ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Susan McVea Ragan Endowed Scholarship honors the life, generosity, and community spirit of a woman devoted to giving back. Born and raised in Louisiana, Susan earned her BA from Louisiana State University and pursued further studies in the United States and abroad. After moving to Pensacola in 1978, she became an active civic leader, supporting cultural and philanthropic organizations and receiving the Junior League of Pensacola's prestigious Joan Gonzalez Award.

For 25 years, Susan co-owned Fiddlestix, a nationally recognized children's store, while balancing family life, faith, and her love of art and antiques. She faced melanoma with remarkable grace and courage, inspiring all who knew her.

Although not a Pensacola State College alumna, Susan deeply valued the College's impact on the community. Her long-standing support culminated in the creation of this endowed scholarship in 2025, ensuring her legacy of generosity will benefit PSC students for generations.

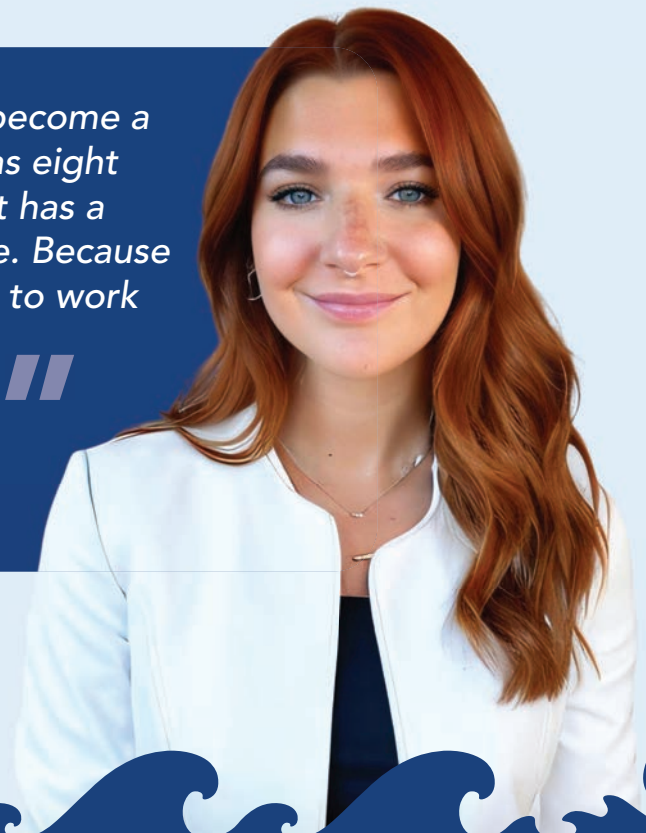

VINCENT JOHN WHIBBS SR. MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP



Vincent “Vince” John Whibbs, Sr. was Pensacola’s longest-serving mayor and a lifelong champion of community service. His visionary leadership helped shape Pensacola through major civic projects. Upon retirement, he was named Mayor Emeritus. A World War II U.S. Army Air Corps fighter pilot, flight instructor, and successful business owner, Vince dedicated his life to service. He served on the College’s District Board of Trustees and his family has supported PSC since 1987.

Established by his son and PSC alumnus, JP Whibbs, this endowment received matching funds from the PSC Alumni Association. The endowment reflects a legacy of leadership, ensuring Vince’s impact endures generations.
